




1. Give the letter name of each of the following notes, including the sharp, flat or natural sign where necessary.

5. Rewrite the following melody with the notes correctly grouped (beamed). Add the missing bar-lines. The melody begins on the first beat of the bar and the first notes are given.




6. Add the missing rest or rests at the places marked * to make each bar complete.


